



Hiking Trails at Mount Vernon Canyon Club

There are five main hiking trails within Mt Vernon Canyon Club's 1,200 acres of land. More than 1,000 acres are held in common by the residents and are only open to residents.

The nearest trail is located directly across Centennial Trail from this house. You can see the trail, which starts immediately to the right of the driveway for the house across the road.

About 100 yards west of the house is the community picnic area. The service road next to the picnic area provides access to three different trails. It also provides access to the Beaver Brook Trail, which is a public trail managed by Jeffco Open Space and Denver Mountain Parks.

The back property line of this house abuts an abandoned section of Aspen Way. It is now a trail. Following it downhill to the west, it intersects the "Five Points" intersection. The picnic area is located directly across the Five Points intersection.

Residents jealously guard the locations of the trails to discourage non-residents from using them. For this reason, no "official" map of the trail system exists.
