Boasting five bedrooms, an expanded chef's kitchen, and tasteful updates throughout, it offers comfort and functionality for modern living. Washer/Dryer in the basement and a second set located in the primary bathroom. The attached two-car garage with electric charging station and three-season outbuilding add convenience and versatility to the large corner lot. Beautiful landscaping enhances the curb appeal, creating a picturesque setting. Ideal for growing families or those seeking ample space, the finished basement and three floors offer endless possibilities. Are you ready to write the next chapter in this home's story?

MAJOR/CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS:

- 1. Addition of front entrance/new front steps.
- 2. Kitchen Gut entire kitchen, bump out 6 ft x 20 ft, complete renovation, including direct access to attached garage.
- 3. First Floor Powder Room gut, relocate, and renovate.
- 4. Master Suite bump out/build bathroom and dressing room above porch (addition of approximately 25 x 11 ft), including laundry and bidet.
- 5. Complete gut and renovation of primary bedroom, including construction of built-in bookcases and window seat.
- 6. Reconfigure/construct laundry room and powder room in basement, including asbestos removal.
- 7. Construction of she-shed/writer's hut in side yard.

OTHER UPDATES & IMPROVEMENTS:

- 1. Electrical Remove all knob and tube wiring throughout house, and update from fuses to circuit breakers.
- 2. Plumbing Replace entire main stack and update pipes in house, including basement and all bathrooms.
- 3. Gut and renovate 2nd floor hallway bathroom, including addition of jetted tub.
- 4. Professional landscape design, including addition of hardwired lawn lighting.
- 5. Renovate basement/man cave, including removal of coal bin/incorporation into main area and new flooring, walls, and ceiling.
- 6. Update third floor bathroom, including addition of shower
- 7. Replace porch windows.
- 8. Replace sunroom windows in second floor bedroom/guest room.
- 9. Remove wall & relocate closet in second floor bedroom/guest room to maximize usable room and natural light.
- 10. Electric baseboard heaters in second floor bedroom/guestroom.
- 11. Skylights in both rooms on third floor.
- 12. Insulate floors in porch.
- 13. Replace/new beadboard ceiling in porch.
- 14. New patio, fences throughout backyard, and construction of vegetable garden and zen/meditation garden.
- 15. Electric car charger in garage.
- 16. New higher capacity water heater.











































OUR STORY

tephanie's parents bought this house in 1965 and Steph and her siblings grew up here. It was always full of music—blasting from all our various stereos. While the house overflowed with life and happiness, it always felt that it had unfulfilled potential. When we were dating in college in the 1970's, we would come here on breaks, walk around the house, and dream about all the updates we would make if we owned the home.

After college, we moved to coastal Massachusetts, and we visited Steph's parents frequently. During our Massachusetts years, we had our first child and purchased our first home. It was a phenomenal Revolutionary era house, with 200 years of history, yet 379 North Fullerton always felt more like home and embodied our history and vision for the future.

Those updates we dreamed of? We accomplished them all—and more—over the next three decades. With every renovation and addition, it was our passion and mission to bring out the full potential of the house that had brought us so much comfort. We wanted it to be the best house it could be while keeping it true to its original colonial style. We also wanted to incorporate the coastal serenity that we fell in love with while in Massachusetts. You will notice nautical elements and spirit as you walk through the home. This is our homage to the feel of New England. Now that we're both retired, we're heading back up north to the Massachusetts coast to enjoy a simpler lifestyle.
