



## POCKET PARKS

WCSA maintains 3 “pocket parks” – green spaces within neighborhoods, offering something special in each location. All are **exclusively for the use of Windward homeowners and their accompanied guests.**

Please observe these rules of use to ensure the peace and safety of neighbors and other park patrons:

- The parks are available for use strictly from **dawn to dusk.**
- Consistent with Fulton County leash laws, dogs must remain on a leash.
- Dog waste must be collected and disposed of properly.
- Do not trespass on neighboring properties.
- At a minimum, observe the City of Alpharetta’s noise ordinance, but more appropriately, remember that the pocket parks are immediately adjacent to homes.
- Personal property left in the park overnight will be removed.
- **Park usage is at your own risk.** Enter safely and responsibly. Children must be accompanied by an adult.
