



Pattison Lake

Pattison Lake Water Access will be closed to the public from Oct. 1 through Nov. 1 as crews remove invasive Eurasian watermilfoil.

Other recreational opportunities in the area include Long Lake (</fishing/locations/lowland-lakes/long-lake-thurston>), Lake St. Clair (</fishing/locations/lowland-lakes/st.-clair-lake>), and Ward Lake (</fishing/locations/lowland-lakes/ward-lake>), all within 5 miles.

Pattison Lake is open year-round and offers good opportunity for fishing for stocked rainbow trout. The lake also supports naturally reproducing populations of largemouth bass, yellow perch, black crappie, and rock bass.

The WDFW access has a boat launch and two toilets on the NE corner of lake. Anglers are reminded that the lake has a 5 mph speed limit year round.



Fishing success for Rainbow Trout is generally best in the spring when thousands of fish are stocked statewide, but they can be caught year-round in most waters with a little patience and persistence. Success remains high into June and gradually declines as water temperatures increase and fish move offshore to stay cool. Fish that escaped the spring harvest return to the nearshore areas in the fall as waters cool off. Some waters may also be stocked again in the fall further boosting catch rates.
