The POA meets approximately once a quarter. A save-the-date email notice will be sent out in advance by Goodwin Management.

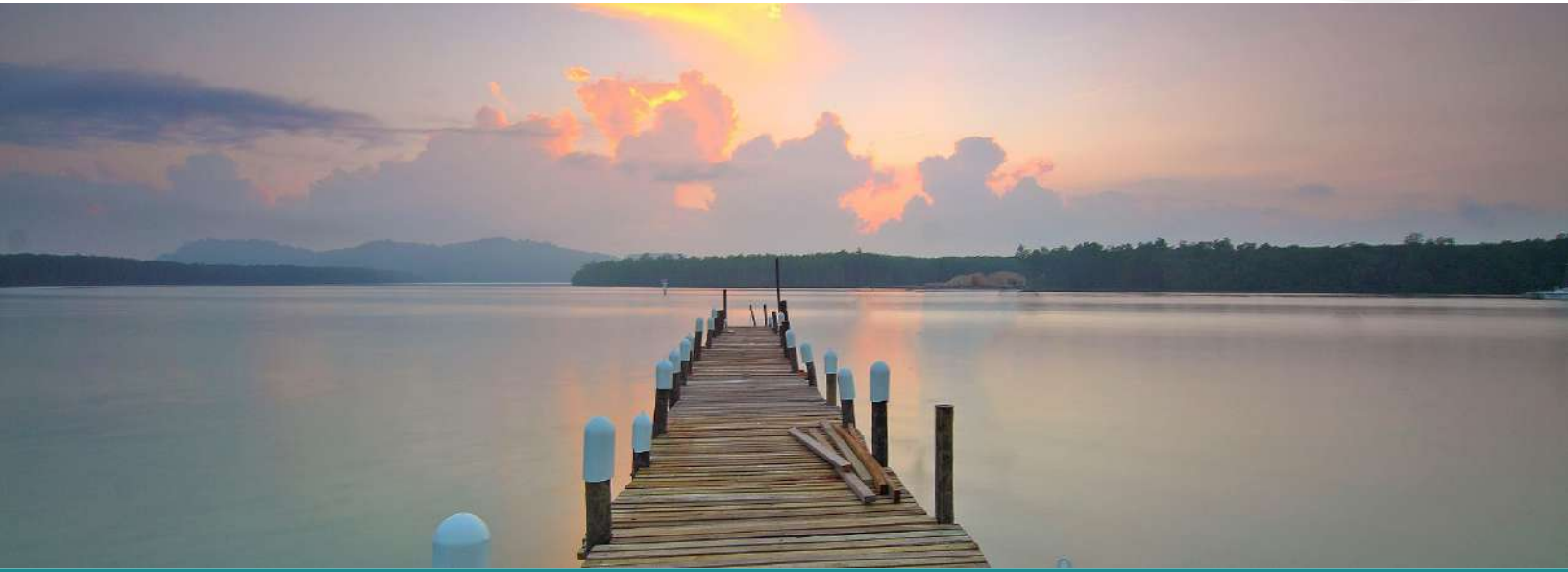

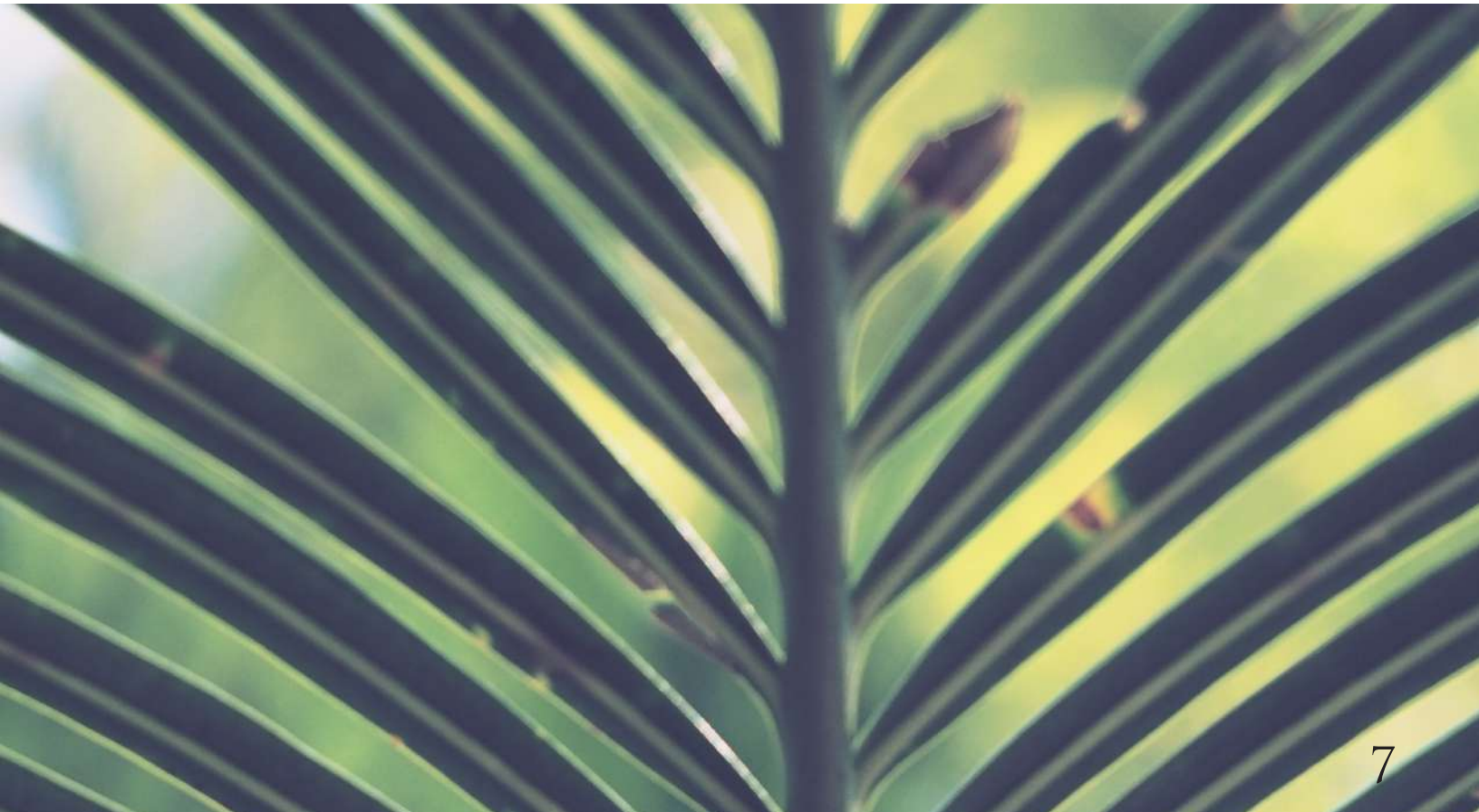
Lakecliff sends out occasional emails and texts to residents and property owners with items of interest and official notifications from the Property Owners Association.

LAKECLIFF SECURITY

Rules for Entry

PROPERTY OWNERS

Property owners may enter at all times via the automatic cartag entry system or codes, or by typing in your personal code on the entry pad. Cartags for your vehicles are available for purchase in the Lakecliff Golf Pro Shop for \$25 each. Condo/cottage and Lodge renters/leasers should get the appropriate QR code for entry. Please contact POA@lakecliff.com for help in downloading our entry system app. You can download the Tekwave app from the Apple or Google stores.

VISITORS

Please provide your visitors with a QR code through the entry app for ease of entry.

OTHER ENTRY

Non-Lakecliff property owners entering for golf, tennis or club events can enter through cartag or QR code. If you do not have one, you can call the Golf Club for entry.

DELIVERY VEHICLES OR SERVICE VENDORS

Entry is allowed from 7am to 6pm Monday through Friday and from 8am to 4pm on Saturday. Please be sure driver has QR code for entry.

CONTRACTORS, WORKERS, LABORERS OR DELIVERIES TO PROPERTY UNDER CONSTRUCTION

All deliveries to construction site must be before 4:00pm. Worker/contractor work hours are 7:30am to 7:00pm Monday through Friday and 8:00am to 4:00pm on Saturday. Exceptions may be granted by a member of the Architectural Committee.

Vehicles must not exceed total gross weight of 66,000 pounds and must have a weight ticket. Concrete trucks must not exceed 10 yards of concrete and must also have a ticket from the concrete plant. No dumpasaurus and no pups pulled behind trucks are allowed. Maximum sized dump truck is 12 yards.

No work is allowed on the following holidays: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day.

FIREWISE COMMUNITY

The national Firewise USA® recognition program provides a collaborative framework to help neighbors in a geographic area get organized, find direction, and take action to increase the ignition resistance of their homes and community and to reduce wildfire risks at the local level. Any community that meets a set of voluntary criteria on an annual basis and retains an “In Good Standing Status” may identify itself as being a Firewise® Site.

The Firewise USA® program is administered by NFPA® and is co-sponsored by the USDA Forest Service and the National Association of State Foresters. While the NFPA® administers this program, individuals and communities participate on a voluntary basis.

Lakecliff on Lake Travis Suggested Guidelines and Actions for Residents and Lot Owners

Empty Lots

- Grass mowed & maintained on a regular basis to no higher than 8” (Please ensure any stranded grass is not dead or dried-out)
- POA will monitor mowing requirements yearly based on weather and mow the lots a minimum of 2 times (If more mowing is required, the POA will notify the owner)
- All trees trimmed-up to a minimum of 6’; however, 8’ is preferable
- All deadwood removed from existing trees
- All dead brush, dead trees, invasive species of brush, shrubs or other debris to be removed from under existing trees or other areas across the site
- Young cedar to be removed
- Mature cedar to be pruned-up from the ground
- Deadwood and leaf litter should be removed or mulched at site and evenly spread
- No burning of any rubbish at any time
- Slopes or Gullies to the Lake must be maintained in the same condition

Homes

- Yards and landscaping to be maintained in a healthy condition
 - Green Grass Lawn
 - Xeriscape
- Sprinkler systems must be installed and maintained
- Create a fire-free area within 5’ of the home using non-flammable landscaping materials such as rocks, crushed stone and gravel (No mulch is to be used in the 5’ fire-free area)
- All trees trimmed-up to a minimum of 6’; however, 8’ is preferable (where possible)
- All deadwood removed from existing trees
- Trim branches away from the home
- Plan landscaping with generous spacing between tree crowns
- All dead brush, dead trees, invasive species of brush, shrubs or other debris to be removed from under existing trees or other areas across the site
- Young cedar to be removed
- Mature cedar to be pruned-up from the ground
- Slopes or Gullies to the Lake must be maintained in the same condition

Outdoor Fire Pits and Fireplaces

- All fire pits and fireplaces must have proper screens on the fire area and chimneys
- No outdoor fire pits, fireplaces, BBQ grills should ever be left unattended until all live coals or embers are extinguished
- It is recommended to have fire extinguishers available incase the embers begin to exceed the fire contained area

CENTRAL TEXAS: Top 5 Ways to Prevent Oak Wilt

Oak Wilt, one of the most destructive tree diseases in the United States, is killing oak trees in Central Texas at epidemic proportions. Managing the disease requires an integrated approach which includes proper identification, preventing new infections, stopping the spread through roots, injecting high-value oaks with fungicide and planting resistant trees.

However, it is best to combat Oak Wilt in your community by preventing new infection centers. Here are the top five best ways to prevent oak wilt:

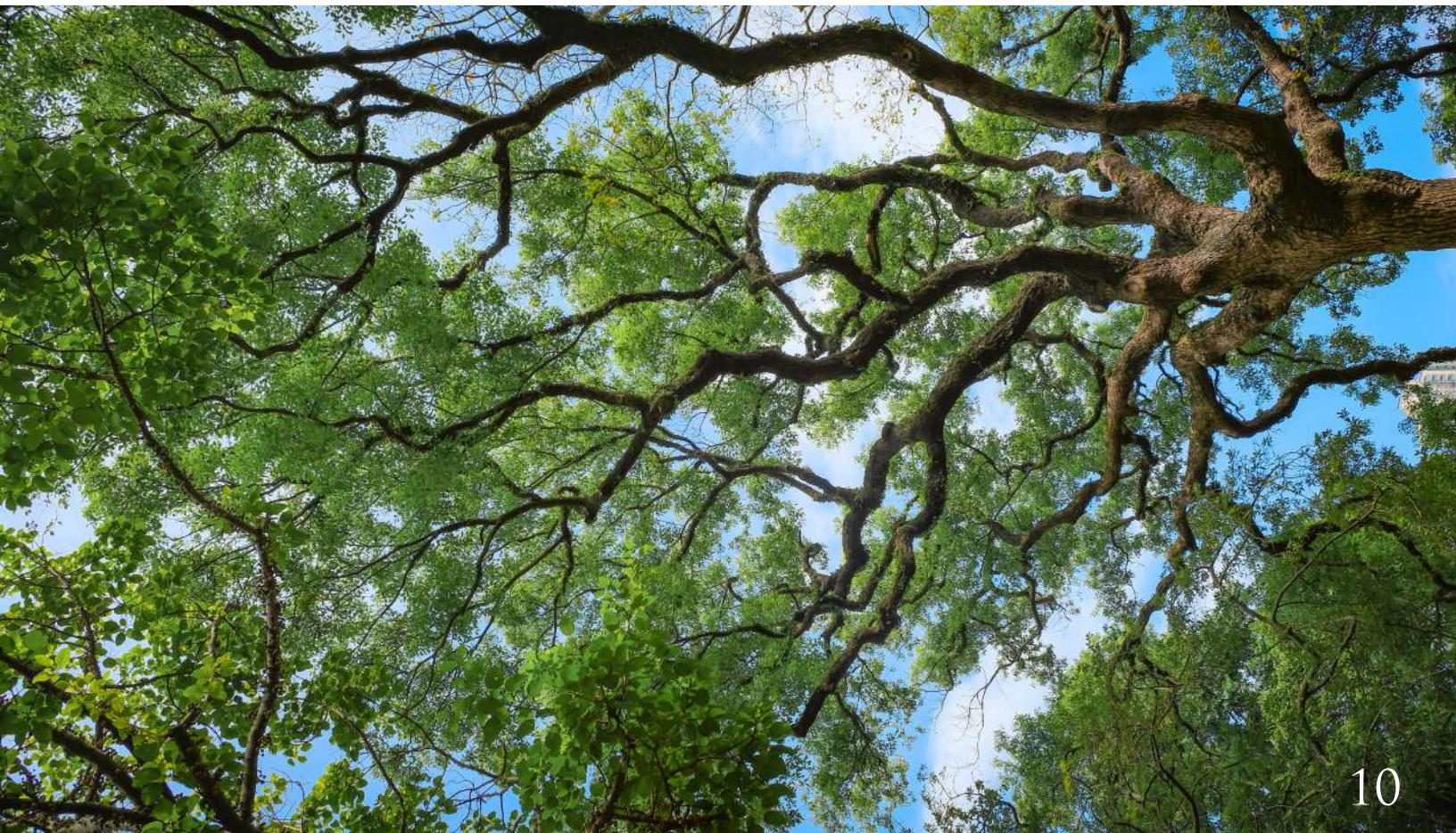
- Don't prune branches on oak trees from February 1-June 30
- Use paint on all cuts or wounds to oak trees
- Destroy all red oaks that are dead or dying near an Oak Wilt disease center
- Don't move any firewood until it is well-seasoned
- Plant native, non-oak species

Volunteering at Highland Lakes Canine Rescue is your answer to all these questions!

Highland Lakes Canine Rescue was founded in 1999, a 501(c)(3) non-profit, no-kill dog rescue organization, by community members who wanted to rescue homeless dogs in Central Texas. We raise 100% of our own funds with no financial support from government agencies or local and national pet rescue organizations.

Our mission is to rescue, rehabilitate and secure loving and healthy forever homes for abandoned dogs in the Texas Hill Country. At HLCR, no-kill is a serious commitment – once we rescue a dog, it will never be euthanized or passed around to other shelters due to space limitations, treatable medical or behavioral issues, or inconvenience. Once a dog makes its way to us it has a forever home for however long it takes to find its forever family.

HLCR is more than just a shelter. In addition to working with local Animal Control Officers, we rescue dogs who are "at risk" in shelters throughout the Central Texas area and as far away as places like Laredo and Seguin. Most importantly we provide an exceptional level of support facilities for our rescue

- Air conditioned and heated indoor kennels with dedicated general population and quarantine
- Large 20' x 40' outdoor pens, agility courses, surgical rehabilitation equipment.
- Extensive walking trails where dogs interact daily with staff and volunteers.

Our select and dedicated network of foster families provide special focused care in homes with special needs. HLCR is the only area shelter that:

- Fully vaccinates every one of our dogs, ensures all are micro-chipped, and spayed or neutered prior to adoption.
- Takes in and TREATS dogs with heartworm, injured and ill dogs until they recover and can become someone's new best friend.
- Works to ensure our dogs obtain optimum health prior to adoption.
- Conducts behavioral interviews and vets potential adopters to ensure dog and adopter are a good match

Highland Lakes Canine Rescue is a special place where everyone will tell you so. You will never be sad when you see what a good life these pups have with us! To check us out, find out more, learn about our volunteer opportunities just go to hlcr.org



Spicewood Arts was formed in May 2000 with the mission to bring the arts to our local community. Our mission has remained constant, but our offerings have expanded significantly over the years to meet the needs of our community.

Our events include:

- **Spicewood Live** - season performances held at Spicewood Vineyards (September through May) bringing great performers of all genres from americana, country, bluegrass, Texas swing, acoustic ending with jazz Toast to Tony in May
- **Art Treks** - comprising of three art trips to neighboring communities/cities to visit museum and local artists as well as a culinary art visit to a local winery when possible
- **Spicewood Arts Festival** - a two-day outdoor juried fine arts festival held the last weekend of October at La Cabana Mexican Restaurant outdoor grounds
- **Membership and Business Sponsorship programs** - provides additional avenues of support as most all our events are budgeted as break-even financial events
- **Annual Gala** - raises money for our school and scholarship programs.

We went big for our 22nd season by increasing our Spicewood Live to six performances and Art Treks to three. This season's Spicewood Live includes something for everyone- blues, country, Celtic/Americana, rock, jazz, and a holiday concert with a singer you'll love. We opened our season with Emily Gimble in October, a new and upcoming country star Triston Marez in November, a holiday special with Bryon Anthony in December and hosted an Art Trek to Salado. Fast forward to March after a much-needed break, we hosted an Art Trek to Austin and have another to San Antonio planned for April. Spicewood Live will host Beyond the Pale in March, the Band of Heathens in April and Kris Kimura and friends at our 11th Toast to Tony Jazz performance in May.

We were able to fund six high school scholarships as well as fund five alumni scholarships due to our generous community donors and hope to do the same this year. We showcase a new local artist each month on our website. Please check out the great talent we have in our community. You can also view all previous featured artists. We continue to look for ways to bring back our two-day Art Festival. If you have the time and passion for the fine arts, please consider leading this effort for us this year. We also have open Board positions. *Our future is limited only by the support that we receive from our community.*

Seeing the need for a local library a group of Spicewood residents created a privately owned public library which opened in 2007. The Spicewood Community Library provides resources for all area residents. Funding for all operations, book purchases and programs come from memberships, donations, fundraising and the library's thrift store sales. They have one part-time county employee and all other staff members are volunteers.

Library cards are free. The collection contains over 10,000 books, audio-books, and DVD movies for all ages. The library is a member of the Central Texas Digital Library consortium which provides an additional 9,000+ digital titles downloadable for 14-day loans in all e-reader formats (e.g. Kindle, Nook, iPad, Android and more). Area residents have access to the library's computers during office hours and Wi-Fi is available 24 hours/day.
